A good field of 68 players enjoyed some steamy Branxton conditions on Saturday with some excellent scores needed to win in most grades. Toby Grant had a round to remember to win A Grade with an outstanding 42 pts, just ahead of the ever-consistent Mick Tracey who had 41 pts, a par round for this talented golfer. Greg Gillard finished third with a pleasing 38 pts, a score that was leading the field until the last few groups finished their rounds. Robert Hale was very pleased with his 37 pts to win B Grade with some solid putting a feature of his round. Kahil Chomiszak and Richard Crooks filled the minor placings with their 36 pts. Hugh Dilley continues to impress with the day's best score of 44 pts allowing him to win C Grade. Glenn Fletcher can consider himself unlucky to finish runner up with an outstanding 43 pts, with Nicholas Redgrove third with 37 pts. 34 pts was needed to win a ball. The highlight of the day belonged to Peter Marquet who nearly hit the perfect shot to the difficult 13th hole, with his shot finishing agonisingly close—2 cms from the cup! Unbelievably it finished behind the cup—so close yet so far! Mick Tracey's shot to the last, just over a metre away was another great shot. Captain Steve Ross continues to challenge the field with some fiercely difficult pin placements on the 7th/16th and the 8th/17th—be prepared for some more challenging holes in the near future. Our current Club Champion, Corey Lamb, has just returned from a very successful NSW Amateur Championship played at the notoriously difficult Magenta Shores and Koowinda Waters where he reached the quarter finals of this prestigious event, losing 3-2 to the talented Jeffery Guan from The Australian (who finished runner up in the final after winning the Medallist title in the stroke event). It was great to see Corey playing Royal Branxton on Saturday after competing in such a quality event during the week.
