Justin Ely, winner of many club championships and Hunter Valley events over the years, showed his quality in winning Sunday's Branxton Open with an amazing 62, 8 under par score. This is one of the lowest scores recorded around Branxton Golf Course although any course record would not have been recorded due to the preferred lies. Such a score is testament to the amazing, improved conditions around Branxton after a very difficult, wet year. Lee Heuston made a welcome return to Branxton to finish runner up with his 71. Dean Fowler, fresh from last week's incredible hole in one on the shortened 17th, won B Grade with his solid 82, just ahead of Chris O'Brien one shot back. Henry O'Neill had a real day out, winning C Grade with his 92, a score which included two Nearest the Pins on the 2nd/11th and 9th/18th. Luke Matt finished only one shot back for runner up. Peter McKenzie has hit a real stretch of good form of late, culminating in him winning the A Grade Nett score with an excellent 65 nett. As it was the lowest Nett score by a Branxton Golf Club member, he also won the prestigious Ted Meyn Memorial Trophy. Benjamin Curry finished runner up with his well compiled 68 nett score. Riley Maytom won the B Grade nett with a 68, just ahead of Jeff Haywood's nett 70—Jeff is starting to hit his straps so look out for him over the next few months. Myles Le Messurier's nett 75 was good enough to win C Grade with Seb Curry runner up with his 77. Lennie Porter's disappointing day on the golf course led to him enjoying a great day as his nett 91 was "good" enough for him to win the Phil Shiven Memorial Trophy. Nathan Pearson won the Pro's Pin on the last whilst the Branxton Open winner, Justin Ely, hit the shot of the day on the 2nd, finishing only 15cm away. He also won the NTP on the 4th/13th which was a strong indicator on how he shot such a great, low score.
