Saturday's Stableford Competition saw all players enjoying the newly renovated 6th green, whilst also playing on the "new" temporary 8th green. From all reports, the new 6th green "looks like a winner", with this new grass very promising for all greens in the future (over some time) being converted to this more easily maintained type of grass. Dave Kinch continued his solid form in winning the A Grade Stableford Competition with an excellent 38 pts, with David Mackenzie (35) and Peter Conroy (33) filling the minor placings. Neil Bridge won B Grade (on a countback) with his 39 pts (which included the Pro Pin on the last), just ahead of Club President Richard Crooks (39) and "Shirl" Miller with his 38 pts. Craig Nicholls had the day's best stableford score in winning C Grade with a wonderful 42 pts, defeating the unlucky Garry Taylor with 41 pts. Geoff Geason's 38 pts was only good enough for third place. 33 pts was needed to win a ball. The "shot of the day" belonged to Andrew Keogh on the 2nd/11th, finishing only 99 cm from the pin, although Eddie Garland's shot to the 4th was only 105 cm away. The story of the day belongs to Pip Lancaster who was under the illusion that the day's event was a stroke event (with the Summer Cup starting) and upon checking with our Captain Steve, was relieved to hear that it was a stableford event after having a 17 on the first hole—he was rather ecstatic after that, especially when he birdied the 17th hole (on the temporary green). He was later letting everyone know how good this temporary green is—gotta love his optimism! Captain Steve would also like to thank all the volunteers who helped with the renovations on Friday and the Summer Cup continues over the next two weeks.
