Sunny and breezy conditions greeted the field today, which was a welcome change from the wet weather during the week. Reece Caldwell took advantage of playing early before the wind picked up to take second place on 36 points on a countback from Neil Jordan also on 36 points. Andrew George continues to play well, and he led the way in C grade with an outstanding score of 41 points. Christian Thompson can feel a little unlucky to finish second on a countback after he also shot 41 points, a score that would usually be good enough to win his division. Both players can be well satisfied with this excellent score in trying conditions. Dean Clack picked up third place with a well compiled 35 points. The temporary greens on the 2nd, 4th and 13th holes caused no problems for Kel Mather, Ben George and Andrew George respectively, with them having no trouble hitting it close, with Kel's shot on the 2nd the shot of the day. John Bowen set the standard early on the 18th and Pro NTP after a wonderful tee shot to 94cm, with nobody being able to better him. A shout out to Steve Eccles who sacrificed his own game today (20 points) in order to support his playing partner in the singles knockout final (see below).

The singles knockout final was played today, with Robert Biles taking on Michael Carling. From all reports it was a very even match played in good spirits. Robert (Bob) took an early 2 hole lead, only for Michael (Mick) to get back to all square after 12 holes.
