A pleasing field of 47 took on the September monthly medal in warm and blustery conditions. Low scores were the order of the day, a vast change from the last few weeks. Chris Zawirski had an outstanding round of 63 nett (74 off the stick) to take the monthly medal. Chris also picked up two NTP's on the 4th and 13th holes so it would appear his iron play was certainly on today. In A grade Mark Moylan shot a very good 77 off the stick to take first place with a 67 nett. Marshall Bronson enjoyed his visit to the course to finish second on 70 and also pick up an NTP on the 2nd hole. Steve Ross was third, one shot further back on 71. Mick Barret continued his good run of form to win B grade with a very handy 65 nett. While Mick was happy with his score, what made him happier was that he beat his playing partner Neil Jordan by one shot, with Neil having 66 to finish second. Mick Carling picked up another prize with a solid 68 to finish third. C grade was the most competitive grade today, with the first five placegetters all finishing below 70 nett. It took a countback to separate Josh Hare and Lee Jackson, who both shot excellent scores of 64 nett, a score which would usually win most stroke events. Josh prevailed in the countback to win the grade, with Lee runner up. Andrew George came third with a good score of 67, and his new golf cart looked at treat out on the course. Andrew Ott had the shot of the day on the 9th hole, finishing only 29cm from the pin to take the NTP on that hole. Steve Eccles won his third pro NTP in a row on the 18th hole, hitting it to 336cm. It was reported that his short irons were better than his driver today, after hitting driver then 3 wood to the green on the 10th hole (short par 4). It would be good to know how far his drive on that hole actually went (I'm guessing not that far!) Brett Trezise also had fun on the 6th tee, ripping his drive into the pine tree near the tee and watching his ball rebound back past the tee and stop just before the creek. After checking his score after the round, let's just say that was the start of the fun for him on that hole :)
