The April monthly medal, sponsored by IGA Branxton, saw 52 players take to the course with overnight rain softening things up a little. The 1st green was back in play for the first time after its reconstruction over Summer and it is looking in great condition. During April the green will be used for competition play only on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays. At all other times the temporary green will continue to be used until notified otherwise.

Mark Moylan won his first monthly medal in a long time with a great score of 66 nett. He was very pleased with how he played and can now look forward to the mug of mugs event in October. Mark picked a good day to play well as he also won his round 2 singles knockout match against Nick Wheeler 5 and 4. In A grade Robert Biles is back to his best, with 68 nett taking the win. David Kinch is back in A grade and straight to the podium after a fine 69 nett. His 39 off the stick on the back nine was enough to take second place on a countback from Peter Mackenzie, also with 69 nett. Peter had a fantastic front nine of 38 off the stick, leading him to being 6 up after 9 holes in his singles knockout match against club junior champion Kyran Reynolds. Kyran started a good comeback, winning holes 10, 12 and 14, but Peter's experience helped win 5 and 3. Peter hit a stunning iron on the 4th which landed next to the hole and rolled to 217cm to take the NTP.

In B grade, Bill Davies took the win with 67 nett. Bill won the medal in March and so must enjoy the stroke events. Bill had putt of the day on the 6th hole, landing a monster birdie putt from the right across the green. Bill stepped it out at 30 paces, so it was a great putt to make. Robert "Shirl" Miller and Robert "Bob" Hale both shot 72 nett, with Shirl taking second place on a countback. Bob's putter didn't play nice on the front nine, otherwise he would have had a very competitive score. Hannah Wilson took out C grade with her 6 over score of 78 nett. She had a great back nine playing it to her handicap. She couldn't believe her score was the winning one, but it just shows that on a stroke day anything is possible. She was one nett shot clear of Carter Swan with his 7 over 77. Carter had a great win over Ben Porter in the singles knockout, winning the match on the last hole. Dean Clack took third place with 78 nett on a countback from Steven Primmer, with both players also successful in their singles knockout matches. In the other NTP's, Zac Henry took the 2nd with 355cm. After that his day became very interesting, seeing all parts of the course including playing his second shot on the 15th hole from the 3rd tee. Cameron Johanson took the NTP on "Barney's Hole" with 284cm, while David Kinch was the best on the 13th green with 800cm. Kyran Reynolds used the bank next to the 9th/18th green to his advantage with 126cm, while Pip Lancaster said his 6 iron to the last to win the Pro NTP was the only good shot he hit all day – good enough to win a nice pro shop voucher.

Quite a few singles knockout matches were played today, with two matches going to the 1st sudden death hole. With the remaining round 1 match to be played next week, thanks to all players for getting their matches played on time.
